Megan Walsh, to discuss connecting MomsFirst participants to Ebi Doula Services. As Mauricea shared her story of being a MomsFirst participant as a teenager and the services she and her family benefited from, it started sounding familiar to Megan. It became clear that Megan and her MomsFirst colleagues facilitated the Baby FAST program Mauricea's family participated in at

the May Dugan Center in 2006 and that there were photos of Mauricea and her family in a collage of MomsFirst photos!


Of her time in MomsFirst in high school, Mauricea said, "being involved in the MomsFirst program, I found a sense of belonging. MomsFirst was extremely important and beneficial to me as I started by journey to

Play is Your Child's Job!




